CULTURAL GEM Perhaps no other American artist has captured the time in which he lived than Norman Rockwell. His paintings of American life bear the strokes of a simpler life that evoke deep emotion by those who view it. Capture the illustrations of Americana with a visit to the Norman Rockwell Museum and experience moments of American life preserved for future generations.

7 STURBRIDGE-MYSTIC SEAPORT, CONNECTICUT-NEWPORT, RHODE ISLAND

After a leisurely morning, visit Mystic Seaport and the Museum of America and the Sea. On to Rhode Island, the "Ocean State" for a free evening.

HISTORY & HERITAGE The Museum of America and the Sea is a living testament to life in the 1800s and the traditions of this New England coastal village on the bracing Mystic Seaport. Learn about whaling life and seafarer tales of old with a fascinating look at life on the New England coast.

8 NEWPORT

Spend your day your way in Newport. Today, enjoy a Newport orientation tour and see the first state house, the nation's oldest synagogue, and St. Mary's Church.
